Brief Information on the Activity	<p>As part of the International Year of Cooperatives 2025, a Financial Literacy Camp was organized on 27th May 2025 by the Department of Cooperation, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu. The camp was specifically designed for rural women from various cooperative societies and SHGs. The key focus was on educating participants through a seminar on A seminar was conducted focusing on three key financial themes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Basics of Money Management: including budgeting, planning, and financial discipline. • Savings and Investment: highlighting the importance of consistent savings and awareness of small-scale investment avenues. • Understanding Credit and Loans: covering interest rates, responsible borrowing, loan repayment, and avoiding debt traps. <p>The sessions were interactive and conducted in the local language for better impact and comprehension</p>
Objective	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To enhance financial awareness and literacy among rural women. • To empower women with knowledge of effective money management and financial planning. • To promote the habit of regular savings and informed investments. • To educate women on responsible borrowing and avoiding debt traps. • To encourage women's active involvement in cooperative societies.

<p>Achievement & Outcomes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Over 45 rural women participated actively and gained foundational financial knowledge. • Improved understanding of budgeting, saving practices, and responsible use of credit. • Participants showed increased interest in utilizing cooperative credit and support systems. • Women were motivated to apply the concepts in real life and guide others in their communities. • The event fostered confidence, self-reliance, and greater financial participation among women in rural areas.

Sonali Bhogle Bandekar</u>, <i>District Development Manager, NABARD,</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emphasized NABARD's ongoing programs supporting women in cooperatives and Self-Help Groups (SHGs). • Highlighted financial inclusion efforts, training modules, and accessibility to rural credit facilities. • Motivated women to explore institutional financing for setting up small-scale businesses and entrepreneurship. <p><u>Shri J.J. Shah</u>, <i>Consultant, Department of Cooperation, DNH & DD,</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivered insights on the <i>Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu Cooperative Societies Regulation, 2024</i>. • Stressed on the importance of regular committee meetings for transparency and effective governance. • Informed that cooperative societies must maintain accounts with nationalized banks. • Societies earning profits are mandated to allocate 25% of net profit to the Reserve Fund, and distribute remaining profits strictly as per their registered bye-laws. • Vacant committee posts may be filled through elections or nominations, following governing rules.

- Elections must be conducted every five years, as per the society's bylaws.
- The Annual General Meeting (AGM) must be held once every year.
