Brief information on the Activity:	As part of their All-India Study Tour, students from the College of Cooperation, Banking & Management, Vellanikkara (KAU) visited NCDFI to gain firsthand knowledge of cooperative governance, financial management, and market operations. The session focused on the role of NCDFI and its eMarket platform in transforming dairy cooperative transactions, bulk commodity trade, and service contracts. The interactive discussions allowed students to engage with industry experts and explore real-world applications of cooperative principles.
