It is the largest producer of all grades of Sugar &amp; Ethanol and is also the largest exporter of both. Brazil with its unique biofuel policy has set an example of ethanol blending and flex fuel cars.</p> <p>With a view to visit prominent sugar &amp; ethanol plants and meet prominent stakeholders including policy makers during Brazil's peak operation period, we at National Sugar Federation in association with Brazilian Embassy in Delhi and Indian Embassy in Brazil planned a 'Brazil Study Visit' under the leadership of Shri Harshvardhan Patil, President, NFCSF and was participated by Managing Director, NFCSF along with stalwarts of Indian Sugar &amp; Allied Sector. The 27 participants included one sitting Minister from Govt. of Maharashtra, One Member of Parliament, One Former Minister, Three MLAs, and Chairmen, Directors, technocrats, Engineers, Trader etc.</p>

India's in roads of AI integration in cane farming &amp; prospects of AI usage in cane breeding is a potential collaboration area.</li> <li>2. Brazil's highest level of plant automation &amp; mechanization in cane farming from planting to harvesting can be replicated in Indian Sugar &amp; Bioenergy sector.</li> <li>3. With G-20 initiated Global Biofuel Alliance, both countries can join together to strengthen South-South Cooperation creating a United voice for the Global South.</li> </ol>
