IYC Report for the month of April, 2025 of NCCE

National Cooperative Union of India

1. Report on Training of Trainers Programme for Cooperative Education Personnel

Introduction

The National Centre for Cooperative Education (NCCE) of NCUI, New Delhi, successfully organized a five-day Training of Trainers (ToT) Programme for cooperative education personnel from 21st to 25th April 2025. The programme brought together 27 participants from seven states, comprising trainers and instructors from district and state cooperative unions as well as cooperative societies across India.

The programme was inaugurated on 21st April 2025, with Smt. Savitri Singh, Deputy Chief Executive, NCUI, interacting with participants and providing a comprehensive overview of the course objectives. The sessions were designed to enhance participants' skills in cooperative education and training, enabling them to deliver impactful training programs in their respective states.

The Training of Trainers (ToT) Programme was designed to enhance the teaching and training capabilities of cooperative education personnel from State and District Cooperative Unions and JCTCs across India. The five-day program aimed to improve participants' skills in delivering impactful cooperative training programs and to equip them with modern training methodologies.

A total of 17 sessions were conducted by experienced faculty, professional trainers, and cooperative experts, covering both theoretical and practical aspects of training.



Day-Wise Summary

Day 1: Monday, 21 April 2025

Theme: Introductory – Basic

1. Registration and Inauguration

- Participants were welcomed and registered by Smt. Kavita Makkar and Shri Gobind Prakash.
- The program was inaugurated by Smt. Savitri Singh (Dy. CE, NCUI), Smt. Inderpreet Kaur (AD, NCCE), and Shri Hemant Yadav (AD, NCCE).

2. Sessions:

Cooperative Concept, Principles & Values

Speaker: Shri Anant Dubey, Deputy Director, NCUI

Focused on the origins, principles, and values underpinning the cooperative movement. National Cooperative Movement in India, Covered MSCS, the New Cooperative Policy, and Model Bylaws.

3. Training Concepts and Qualities of Trainers

Speaker: Col. Hari Varma, Professional Trainer

- Introduced training theories and methods.
- Highlighted the interpersonal skills required for effective trainers.



Shri Dileep Sanghani, President, NCUI, addressed the participants, encouraging them to engage actively in the sessions and to utilize the knowledge gained to strengthen cooperative education at the grassroots level. His interaction served as a major source of motivation for the participants.

During the visit, participants interacted with KRIBHCO officials, toured their soil and seed testing Labs, and gained insights into innovative practices and sustainability initiatives.

He also spoke on the Role of Social Media in Cooperatives, highlighting its importance in communication, outreach, and engagement with stakeholders, Recent initiatives undertaken by the Ministry of Cooperation and explained the functions and activities of NCUI in supporting and strengthening the cooperative movement.

Shri S.C. Pradhan, Principal, Delhi State Cooperative Training Centre (DSCTC), led sessions on Bye laws, RGB member, Management Practices in IFFCO, Digitalisation and Use of Technology in Cooperatives, and Human Resource Management (HRM) and Communication, Role of Cooperatives in Agriculture and Rural Development — key areas for modern cooperative development and organizational effectiveness.

The programme was well-received by IFFCO officials, who appreciated the relevance and practical application of the topics discussed. It concluded with an interactive session.

I. EDP Session, Najafgarh, Delhi (April 7th – 11th, 2025)

NCUI organized a transformative EDP from April 7th to April 11th, 2025 at Social Vision, Najafgarh. This initiative aimed to provide diverse livelihood alternatives for participants, with a particular focus on empowering women by equipping them with practical skills and sustainable income-generating opportunities.

Day 1: Eco-Friendly Innovations with Bio-Enzymes (April 7, 2025)

The program commenced with an enlightening session led by **Rinku Thakur**, a master trainer from the Incubation Centre, on the applications of bio-enzymes. Participants were introduced to the concept of creating eco-friendly products using waste from citrus fruits. Trainer A demonstrated how items like washroom cleaners, hand soaps, and multi-purpose household cleaners could be crafted sustainably. The session was interactive, drawing keen participation from **27** women who eagerly engaged in discussions about reducing waste and adopting sustainable practices for daily use and potential entrepreneurship.



Day 2: Exploring the Potential of Cow Dung Products (April 8, 2025)

On the second day, **Ritu Saini** conducted an innovative training session focused on transforming cow dung into artistic and functional household decor items. With an emphasis on creating eco-conscious and marketable products, the session showcased techniques for crafting items such as decorative artifacts, paperweights, and plantable diyas. The training drew **30** participants, many of whom expressed excitement about the versatility and commercial potential of these products. Waste flower dhoopbatti



Day 3: Candle-Making (April 9, 2025)

The third day introduced participants to the art of candle making, led by **Sashi Mathoor**. The session covered various techniques for crafting decorative and scented candles, which hold immense market demand. Participants, totalling **30** women, were guided through the process of selecting materials, designing, and finishing products to meet customer preferences. This session provided not just a creative outlet but also an opportunity for attendees to envision a viable income stream.



Day 4: Jewelry Making (April 11, 2025)

The program concluded with an inspiring session on jewelry making conducted by **Alpana Jha**. Attended by 35 women, the training focused on crafting elegant jewelry pieces using readily available materials, including waste flowers. The session highlighted techniques for designing unique, handcrafted items that combine creativity with sustainability, appealing to both local and urban markets. Participants showed great enthusiasm and expressed keen interest in leveraging this eco-friendly skill as a potential entrepreneurial opportunity.



Impact and Outlook

The EDP sessions successfully equipped participants with practical knowledge and hands-on experience in creating marketable products across four different domains. By focusing on sustainable and eco-friendly practices, the program not only empowered women with alternative livelihood opportunities but also instilled a sense of environmental responsibility.

II. Community Meeting with Transgender Community

On 8th April 2025, a community meeting with the transgender community associated with Alliance India was convened, attended by 12 individuals at Shadipur Depot. The meeting focused on fostering empowerment, skill development, and cooperative spirit among the attendees.

Empowering transgender individuals is essential for building a more inclusive society and promoting their active participation in economic activities. Cooperative development not only enhances their collective strength but also provides a sustainable platform for social and economic upliftment.

Ms. Anu conducted the training session, introducing the participants to various EDP organized by NCUI. She also highlighted the skill development training available at the Noida Skill Development Centre, including specialized programs in baking, stitching, information technology, and other vocational skills. Additionally, she provided detailed guidance on the formation and benefits of SHGs and cooperatives, encouraging the attendees to explore these opportunities further.

Currently, the community has formed two groups, although they are yet to be registered. One group is engaged in parlor work, while the other focuses on boutique work. Efforts will be undertaken to formalize and register these groups, enabling them to access institutional support and resources for their growth and sustainability.



III. Sankalp Multipurpose Cooperative Society meeting with RCS

To formalize the operations of the Sankalp Multipurpose Cooperative Society, a meeting was held on 10th April 2025 with a representative from the Registrar of Cooperative Societies (RCS). The representative discussed the functions and objectives of the cooperative society, highlighting its role in promoting self-help, mutual aid, and sustainable economic development among its members. Additionally, the representative elaborated on the significance of the bye-laws, which serve as the foundational rules governing the internal operations, membership criteria, decision-making processes, and financial management of the cooperative society.

The representative also shared valuable insights into the advantages and operational mechanisms of cooperative societies in India. These include their ability to provide members with collective bargaining power, access to credit and markets, and opportunities for capacity building and economic empowerment. The discussion aimed to ensure that the women members of the society were well-informed about the benefits and responsibilities associated with forming and running a cooperative.



Training Programme Report CEAS of NCRC

CEAS of NCRC organised two Training Programme on “Exploring Pathways to Diversification and Growth in Agri-Allied Multi-State Cooperatives” from 2 - 4 April 2025. This programme was organized for Non-Credit Multi State Cooperative Societies of India. With a strong focus on Ease of Doing Business (EoDB), legal and policy reforms, and structural strengthening, the cooperative sector is now well-positioned to explore new business opportunities. While credit cooperatives such as PACS are being modernized, non-credit Multi-State Cooperative Societies (MSCS) in Agri & Allied, Agro-Processing, Marketing, Consumer, Multipurpose Societies and Federations have significant potential to diversify their activities and enhance their competitiveness. The programme was attended by 32 participants from Kerala, Telangana, Tamilnadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and New Delhi. All the lectures were delivered by subject experts.
