1. Social Protection Camp at Skill Development Centre, Noida

After assessing the needs of the local community, it was evident that many residents required assistance in understanding and accessing various government social protection schemes. To address this, the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development and Cooperation (CEDC), a social protection camp was organized on 4th February 2025 at the NOIDA Skill Development Centre (SDC). The primary goal of this camp was to raise awareness about Central and State Government schemes and to help people obtain essential documents required to access these benefits. By bridging the gap between the government and citizens, the camp ensured that eligible individuals were equipped with the necessary documentation to avail themselves of these schemes.

Objectives of the Camp

- To educate citizens about various government social protection schemes.
- To highlight the importance of essential documents such as Aadhar, PAN, Voter ID, Ayushman Card, ABHA Card, and others.
- To assist individuals in obtaining key identification documents.
- To promote digital literacy and encourage the use of Digi locker for secure document storage.

Outcomes

The camp successfully supported 54 beneficiaries by facilitating the following services:

- **PAN Card Applications:** 5 individuals applied.
- **Voter ID Card Applications:** 3 individuals applied.
- **ABHA Cards Issued:** 23 individuals received their cards.
- **DigiLocker Accounts Created:** 23 individuals set up their accounts.

Additionally, all attendees received hands-on digital literacy training, equipping them with the skills to access government services online efficiently.

The social protection camp effectively met its objective of increasing awareness and accessibility to government schemes and essential documents. The initiative had a positive impact on the local community, helping them take advantage of various welfare programs.

Looking ahead, additional social protection camps will be organized to strengthen connections between citizens and a wide range of government welfare schemes and services, ensuring broader outreach and support.



2. Orientation Meeting at SDC

On February 13, 2025, an orientation meeting session was held with the locals at the SDC. This meeting aimed to provide women with essential skills and knowledge to help them gain empowerment and opportunities through various training programs.

- i. Approximately 15 to 20 women participated in the orientation meeting. During the session, the attendees were introduced to the NCUI Incubation courses, which will offer a wide range of vocational training.
- ii. The courses are mentioned below:
 - a. Bakery and Confectionary
 - b. Computer course and web Designing
 - c. Cutting Tailoring and Dressing making
 - d. Solar & Electrical Training Programme
 - e. Data Entry Operator and many more.
- iii. The women were informed about the duration of these training programs and the practical benefits they would gain upon completion.

Government Schemes and Welfare

During the meeting, the women were also briefed about various government schemes that could provide them with financial and social security benefits. These schemes include:

- i. Atal Pension Yojana
- ii. Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana
- iii. E-Shram Card
- iv. Social Security and Social Welfare Schemes

The attendees raised several questions about how they can benefit from these schemes, how they can enroll in them, and what opportunities are available for them in the future. Mr. Abhishek Agrawal addressed all these questions and provided detailed information to ensure the women were well-informed about the processes involved.

Cybersecurity and Digital Literacy Session

The event also featured a session on Cybersecurity and Digital Literacy. The session covered essential topics such as:

- i. Mobile maintenance
- ii. Preventing fraud calls
- iii. Other cybersecurity measures

The women were given valuable information on how to secure their digital presence, protect their personal information, and maintain the security of their mobile devices.

The inauguration of the NCUI Incubation Courses was a significant step towards empowering women with the necessary skills and knowledge to improve their livelihoods. The event provided valuable insights into government welfare schemes, skill development opportunities, and essential cybersecurity practices. With the guidance of expert trainers and the support of the NCUI, the women who attended the session are now better equipped to enhance their skills and access various opportunities in the future.



3. Efforts Towards Women's Empowerment by CEDC in February

Between February 14th and 25th, CEDC undertook significant efforts to promote its initiatives and training programs. Ms. Anu led an extensive outreach campaign, covering areas such as Barola, Buragaon, Kakrala, Agar Basti, and Sector 81 in Noida. A door-to-door survey was conducted in these areas to engage with the community and raise awareness about CEDC's programs.

Following these efforts, a few women from the surveyed areas visited SDC in Noida to explore various courses. They were introduced to the wide range of training programs available, which aim to equip women with the skills needed for livelihood generation and financial independence.

During the outreach, Ms. Anu also emphasized the role of NCUI Haat in supporting Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and cooperatives. She explained how NCUI facilitates the formation of SHGs, provides a platform for showcasing and selling their products, and helps generate sustainable incomes. Ms. Anu highlighted the numerous advantages of SHGs and cooperatives, such as financial empowerment, increased access to opportunities, and the ability to work collaboratively towards shared goals.

In addition, Prayatna NGO, in collaboration with the HCL Foundation, organized a program at the SDC. This provided CEDC with an excellent opportunity to promote its initiatives and engage with participants, sharing information about the training programs and the benefits of joining SHGs and cooperatives.

These combined efforts by CEDC aim to sensitize women to the value of skill development, entrepreneurship, and collective action. By fostering women's empowerment and promoting sustainable livelihoods, the initiative reflects NCUI's steadfast commitment to community development through its Skill Development and Incubation Centres.



4. Field Visit to Myorpur, Sonbhadra, Uttar Pradesh

As part of its ongoing efforts to promote agroecology and cooperative development across India, a field visit was organized in Sonbhadra, Uttar Pradesh, on 28th February 2025. Supported by the Aditya Birla Foundation (ABF), the initiative provided comprehensive training on sustainable agricultural practices to 80 farmers, volunteers, and field staff from the Myorpur region. Notably, ABF operates across 300 villages in Sonbhadra, working in distinct clusters to drive community development.

Sumit Singh, Advisor – Strategy and Cooperation, offered in-depth guidance on the governance, formation, and bylaws of SHGs, cooperatives, and Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs). He highlighted NCUI's initiatives, such as the NCUI Haat and Skill Development Centre, which are designed to empower entrepreneurs and promote cooperative development nationwide. Additionally, he detailed the GIZ project's focus on advancing agroecology to enable sustainable farming practices across India. With NCUI's support, plans are underway to form 15 cooperatives in Myorpur.



Dr. G.P. Singh, a member of NCUI's Advisory Council, led a session on integrated farming techniques. He emphasized innovative strategies for effective land utilization, such as multi-layer farming, where crops are cultivated based on height to optimize yield in a limited area.

Abhishek Agarwal contributed to the training by addressing digital literacy and introducing government schemes that benefit farmers. He showcased the NIVESH portal, an essential tool for connecting farmers to government schemes, making it easier to access critical resources and services.

This collaborative effort underscores the importance of agroecology and integrated farming in fostering sustainable agriculture. By equipping farmers with the necessary knowledge and tools, the initiative aims to improve livelihoods and drive community empowerment. Furthermore, ABF sought NCUI's support to facilitate proper certification of vocational training conducted at their centers, strengthening skill development efforts in the region.

1. Development of Generic and Sectoral Coop Training Module (Activities undertaken to develop this and its status)

1.1 Status of Generic Training Modules: Out of 11 planned Generic modules, 6 modules have been finalized and published, namely – Members role in cooperatives, Governance in Cooperatives, Community Mobilisation & Registration of Cooperatives, Legal Compliance of Cooperatives, Auditing of Cooperatives, Business development planning in Cooperatives.

1.2 Status of Sectoral Training Module – Out of 17 planned sectoral modules, 7 sectoral modules have been finalized and published, namely – Urban coop banking, rural coop banking, fisheries coops, marketing coops, health coops, PACS and housing.

The proofreading of the three training module for the sector of sugar, labour and handloom cooperatives has been completed in this month.

2. Conduct of Research, Presentation in the Conference and Publications:

- As part of the IYC2025 State wise one day Conference on Promotion and Development of Cooperatives in Tripura State, organised by the GCP division of NCUI in collaboration with Tripura State Coop Union and Cooperation department on 4th Feb. 2025:
 - Delivered a expert talk on “The Changing Landscape of PACS, Dairy & Fisheries: Unlocking Business Potential” - by Dr S K Wadkar, Adviser, NCUI.
 - Delivered a expert talk on Role, function & initiatives of NCUI for empowering Cooperatives and objectives of IYC 2025 - by Shri. Ritesh Dey, Executive Director, NCUI.
- As part of the National Conference of CEOs of Rural Cooperative Banks, under the theme: Leveraging Cooperative Credit Structure for Inclusive Growth, organized by RBI-CAB on 24 and 25 Feb., 2025 at Pune:
 - Dr. S. K. Wadkar (Adviser, NCUI), represented NCUI as a resource person and delivered a talk on “Innovative and Inclusive Strategies for Rural Cooperative Banks (RCBs)”.

3. Secretarial Assistance in Conduct of Training Modules Development/ Research & Studies/ Webinars:

- For the wide publicity for the prevention of fraudulent activities in Multi-State Cooperative Societies, developed a detailed content aimed at educating and safeguarding existing and potential members. The content is being reviewed by the CRCS Office. Upon approval the audio-visual aids will be developed. The content includes the following key aspects:
 - **Do’s** – Guidelines on best practices for members to ensure secure and responsible participation in cooperative societies.

- **Don'ts** – Precautions to avoid fraudulent schemes and unauthorized activities.
 - **Rights of Depositors as Members** – Awareness about the legal and financial rights of depositors.
 - **Duties of Members** – Responsibilities that member should uphold for transparency and cooperative governance.
 - **General Public Awareness** – A concise guide for due diligence by individuals engaging with various agencies or promoters involved in forming new cooperatives.
- Developed two book chapter titled “Member Centric Approach” and “Networks and Value Additions”.
 - **Expanded FAQs for the CIO Training Programme:** Enhanced the FAQ section by incorporating additional questions and answers to provide clarity on key provisions, compliance requirements, and the role of Cooperative Information Officers (CIOs) under the Multi-State Cooperative Societies Act. The updated content aims to streamline understanding, improve governance, and facilitate smooth implementation of recent amendments and regulatory guidelines.
 - **Prepared a detailed write-up on the Madurai Consumer Cooperative Store:** Documented the history, operational model, governance structure, business activities, and impact of the Madurai Consumer Cooperative Store. The write-up highlights its role in ensuring fair pricing, promoting cooperative values, and enhancing consumer welfare, along with its contributions to the local economy and community development.
 - **Prepared Write-up on "Sensitizing Government: Policies for Cooperative Growth":** Developed a comprehensive document highlighting key policy interventions, regulatory frameworks, and government initiatives aimed at fostering the growth of the cooperative sector. The write-up emphasizes the role of policy advocacy, financial support mechanisms, and institutional strengthening to enhance the sustainability and competitiveness of cooperatives.
 - **Value Addition in the Training Module on Credit Cooperatives:** Incorporated reviewers' feedback to enhance the training module by refining content on governance, financial management, risk assessment, regulatory compliance, and best practices in credit cooperatives. The revisions aim to improve clarity, relevance, and practical application for cooperative stakeholders.
