1. Three Days Leadership Development Programme for Chairpersons & Directors of Consumer Cooperatives of India.

A total of 49 representatives from various states actively participated in the program.

1. Community Meeting Report

Date: 05-05-2025 (Monday)

Venue: Yash Seva Samiti, Bindapur, Uttam Nagar

Organizer: NCUI Incubation Centre

On Monday, May 5, 2025, the NCUI Incubation Centre organized a community meeting at Yash Seva Samiti, Bindapur, Uttam Nagar. A total of 20 women participated in the meeting.

The purpose of the meeting was to provide information to women about various training programs conducted at the Skill Development Centre. Detailed insights were shared about the **CDP (Capacity Development Programme)**, **EDP (Entrepreneurship Development Programme)**, and **ATP (Advanced Training Programme)**.

Additionally, the women were educated about Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and Cooperatives. They were also guided on how to leverage NCUI Haat and online platforms to market and sell their products after production.

Some women participants expressed interest in ventures related to food products. They were briefed about the process to initiate work in this sector, including required training, registration, and other essential steps.

The meeting was a success, and the women showed interest and enthusiasm in enrolling for the EDP program's training sessions.



2. Meeting Report

On May 7, 2025, women undergoing training at the NCUI Incubation Centre visited the Namami Gange office at Major Dhyan Chand Stadium, New Delhi. The women brought along the products they had created, where they had the opportunity to meet the Namami Gange team and Mr. Jagmohan Gupta.

Mr. Jagmohan Gupta provided detailed insights to the participants about the objectives of the Namami Gange project, its areas of operation, and its contributions to the Ganga Cleanliness Campaign and biodiversity conservation awareness programs. He also shared information about the Delhi Haat stalls, where products from across the country are exhibited and sold. Furthermore, he mentioned plans to launch similar stalls at every riverbank in the near future and informed them about a warehouse in Azadpur where SHG (Self-Help Groups) have been engaged in packaging work.

Subsequently, our team presented details about the **Incubation Centre**, **NCUI Haat**, and **Co-op Kitchen**, alongside information about various training programs conducted at the Skill Development Centre in Noida, Sector-80.

During the meeting, discussions were held on how NCUI and Namami Gange could collaborate in the future to empower women, promote local products, and contribute to environmental improvements through collective efforts.



3. Social Protection Camp

During the camp, students from grades 10 to 12 were trained on how to create various government documents such as Aadhaar Cards, PAN Cards, ABHA Cards, Voter IDs, and E-Shram Cards. The students enthusiastically participated in the session and practically assisted their family members in creating these documents.

Approximately 40 to 50 local residents benefited from the camp by availing themselves of document creation services.

The event was supported by NGO members, teachers, and volunteers.
