This Kendra became operational on 07th June, 2024, and is functioning under License No. RLF20JK2024000717. Since its opening, the Kendra has made remarkable progress in fulfilling its core objective — ensuring the availability of quality generic medicines at affordable prices to the common public. These medicines are offered at prices that are approximately 50% to 80% lower than their branded counterparts, thereby significantly reducing the out-of-pocket healthcare expenditure for patients especially those from rural and economically weaker sections. From 07th February, 2024 to 31st March, 2025, the Jan Aushadhi Kendra has recorded a total sale of ₹7,32,000, reflecting strong community engagement and a rising preference for cost-effective healthcare solutions. Beyond healthcare delivery, this Jan Aushadhi Kendra has also contributed positively towards local economic empowerment. It has provided a sustainable livelihood to Mr. Ronit Sharma, son of Subash Chander, who is a member of the Pallanwala MPCS. His active involvement in the daily operations of the Kendra demonstrates how this initiative is not only improving health outcomes but also creating meaningful employment opportunities at the grassroots levels. The continued success of the Jan Aushadhi Kendra at CHC Khour is a testament to the impactful implementation of PMBJP — bringing affordable healthcare within reach while simultaneously strengthening rural entrepreneurship and cooperative societies.
